Nelson Mandela was an anti-apartheid activist. He served 27 years in prison and following his release from prison on 11 February 1990, Mandela led his party in the negotiations that led to multi-racial democracy in 1994. As president from 1994 to 1999, he frequently gave priority to reconciliation.

Saint Maximilian Kolbe was a Polish Conventual’s Franciscan friar who volunteered to die in place of a stranger in the Nazi concentration camp of Auschwitz in Poland. Pope John Paul II declared him “The Patron Saint of Our Difficult Century”.

TERM 5 – MOTHER TERESA (D.O.B 26th Aug, 1910; D.O.D 5th Sep, 1997)**Tuesday 26th April 2011 – Friday 27th May 2011**

Mother Teresa was an Indian Catholic nun of Albanian origin who founded the Missionaries of Charity in Kolkata, India in 1950. For over 45 years she ministered to the poor, sick, orphaned, and dying, while guiding the Missionaries of Charity's expansion, first throughout India and then in other countries. Following her death she was beatified by Pope John Paul II and given the title Blessed Teresa of Calcutta.
